SPARKS DEMOCRAT <input type="radio"/> KARA THOMPSON REPUBLICAN <input type="radio"/> _____	INITIATIVE NO. 181 (VOTE IN ONE OVAL) A LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION I-181 establishes the Montana Biomedical Research Authority to oversee and review grant applications for the purpose of promoting the development of therapies and cures for brain diseases and injuries and mental illnesses, including Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, brain cancer, dementia, traumatic brain injury and stroke. The grants, which are funded by state general obligation bonds, can be used to pay the costs of peer-reviewed biomedical research and therapy development, recruiting scientists and students and acquiring innovative technologies at Montana biomedical research organizations. I-181 provides specifics for the Montana Biomedical Research Authority's membership, powers, staffing, grant eligibility and evaluation requirements, and reporting requirements. I-181 authorizes the creation of state bond debts for \$20 million per year for a period of ten years. State general fund costs for debt service and other expenses would be \$17.38 million total for the first four years and peak at \$16 million per year for fiscal years 2027-2037. <input type="radio"/> YES ON INITIATIVE I-181 <input type="radio"/> NO ON INITIATIVE I-181	GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS TO DESIGN, REMODEL, EQUIP, AND FURNISH THE COUNTY DETENTION CENTER FACILITY (VOTE IN ONE OVAL) Shall the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") of Lewis and Clark County, Montana (the "County") be authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds of the County, in one or more series in the aggregate principal amount of up to six million five hundred thousand dollars (\$6,500,000), bearing interest at rates to be determined by the Board, payable semiannually during the term of not to exceed fifteen (15) years and redeemable on any date after one-half of their term, for the purpose of paying the issuance costs of the bonds and the costs of designing, remodeling, equipping and furnishing the county detention center facility to provide holding capacity for approximately 160 inmates through the remodeling of all three floors so that the entire facility will only be utilized for detention center purposes and programs and will be located at 221 Breckenridge in Helena, Montana? If this bond issue is approved, based on the estimated costs of the proposed project of \$6,500,000, the most recent assessed values of taxable property in the County and assuming an interest rate on the bonds of 4.00% per annum and a term of 15 years, the bonds issued in their maximum authorized amount would result in an estimated annual tax increase on a home, with a current assessed value of \$100,000, of \$6.22 and an estimated annual tax increase on a home, with a current assessed value of \$200,000, of \$12.44. The County will not issue the bonds or remodel the detention center facility as indicated unless the voters of the County also approve a companion mill levy election for paying the costs of the operation and maintenance of the detention center facility by imposition of a detention center facility annual mill levy for a fifteen year term. <input type="radio"/> BONDS - YES <input type="radio"/> BONDS - NO
FOR COUNTY COMMISSIONER DISTRICT #3 (VOTE FOR ONE) <input type="radio"/> MATTHEW ELSAESSER DEMOCRAT <input type="radio"/> JIM MCCORMICK REPUBLICAN <input type="radio"/> _____	INITIATIVE NO. 182 (VOTE IN ONE OVAL) A LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION I-182 renames the Montana Marijuana Act to the Montana Medical Marijuana Act and amends the Act. I-182 allows a single treating physician to certify medical marijuana for a patient diagnosed with chronic pain and includes post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) as a "debilitating medical condition" for which a physician may certify medical marijuana. Licensing requirements, fees and prohibitions are detailed for medical marijuana dispensaries and testing laboratories. I-182 repeals the limit of three patients for each licensed provider, and allows providers to hire employees to cultivate, dispense, and transport medical marijuana. I-182 repeals the requirement that physicians who provide certifications for 25 or more patients annually be referred to the board of medical examiners. I-182 removes the authority of law enforcement to conduct unannounced inspections of medical marijuana facilities, and requires annual inspections by the State. <input type="radio"/> YES ON INITIATIVE I-182 <input type="radio"/> NO ON INITIATIVE I-182	ANNUAL LEVY FOR FIFTEEN YEARS FOR OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE COUNTY'S PROPOSED REMODELED DETENTION CENTER (VOTE IN ONE OVAL) Shall the Board of County Commissioners be authorized to establish a detention center facility annual mill levy for 15 years of approximately 31.75 mills to raise \$4,000,000 annually for the operation and maintenance of the County's proposed remodeled detention center facility, including additional staff, services and programs, where the new levy of approximately 31.75 mills to raise \$4,000,000 annually will be subject to Section 15-10-420(1)(a), MCA after the first year allowing for inflationary growth and newly taxable growth? It is estimated by the County that, using current assessed values of taxable property, for a home valued at \$100,000, taxes would be increased annually by the levy in the amount of \$42.86 and for a home valued at \$200,000, taxes would be increased annually by the levy in the amount of \$85.72. The imposition of the annual levy for 15 years for maintenance and operation of the proposed remodeled detention center facility is contingent on the voter approval of the \$6,500,000 general obligation bonds of the County for such remodeling of the facility. <input type="radio"/> MILL LEVY - YES <input type="radio"/> MILL LEVY - NO

CONSTITUTIONAL INITIATIVE NO. 116 (VOTE IN ONE OVAL) A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION CI-116 would add a new section to the Montana Constitution establishing specific rights for crime victims. The rights enumerated include the right to participate in criminal and juvenile justice proceedings, to be notified of major developments in the criminal case, to be notified of changes to the offender's custodial status, to be present at court proceedings and provide input to the prosecutor before a plea agreement is finalized, and to be heard at plea or sentencing proceedings, or any process that may result in the offender's release. CI-116 guarantees crime victims' rights to restitution, privacy, to confer with the prosecuting attorney, and to be informed of their rights. CI-116 defines specific terms and requires no further action by the Legislature for implementation. CI-116, if passed by the electorate, will become effective immediately. Fiscal impacts are expected for the Office of the Public Defender, Judicial Branch, Department of Corrections and local governments from passage of CI-116, but those costs could not be accurately determined at this time. <input type="radio"/> YES ON CONSTITUTIONAL INITIATIVE CI-116 <input type="radio"/> NO ON CONSTITUTIONAL INITIATIVE CI-116		
INITIATIVE NO. 177 (VOTE IN ONE OVAL) A LAW PROPOSED BY INITIATIVE PETITION I-177 generally prohibits the use of traps and snares for animals on any public lands within Montana and establishes misdemeanor criminal penalties for violations of the trapping prohibitions. I-177 allows the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks to use certain traps on public land when necessary if nonlethal methods have been tried and found ineffective. I-177 allows trapping by public employees and their agents to protect public health and safety, protect livestock and property, or conduct specified scientific and wildlife management activities. I-177, if passed by the electorate, will become effective immediately. I-177 reduces approximately \$61,380 of state funds annually, resulting from a loss of trapping license revenue.
