

FINAL SCHEDULE

*** As of July 7th, Lewis & Clark County Public Health issued an [order limiting events to less than 250 people total](#), regardless of if they aren't there all at the same time. We were very lucky to be able to submit [separate event plans for each day of our Fair](#) to meet this requirement, but it means we must be conscientious of how many people show up to our events throughout the day. Please pay special attention to the livestock sale instructions and limitations. Please keep in mind Public Health has the right to shut us down if we aren't meeting their guidelines. "This order will be enforced through a complaint driven process where law enforcement will observe and document violations of this order and provide report to Lewis and Clark County Attorney for enforcement against the event or gathering organizer and attendees. Event or gathering organizers may face a misdemeanor charge under MCA 50-2-124 for each attendee at the event or gathering."

It is imperative we pay attention to who attends the events (no general public) and that we are physical distancing/wearing masks between family groups, regardless of if you hang out together on your own time or not. We can do it!
