

RON SCHATZ PROJECT AWARD

INTRODUCTION: Ron Schatz, a farmer/rancher in the Helena Valley, passed away April 2013. Mr. Schatz was a long time 4-H member of the Birdseye High Altitude 4-H Club in Lewis and Clark County. He was active as a member of agricultural projects and events. He continued his involvement throughout his adult life as a 4-H leader of the Birdseye High Altitude 4-H Club. Mr. Schatz participated in the development of the 4-H Fair efforts at the Helena Civic Center to Warren School to the building of the 4-H Community Center and to the present 4-H Building on the Lewis and Clark County Fairgrounds.

Ron Schatz continued his interest and support of the 4-H program through leadership and family participation. The Schatz family has dedicated funds to encourage youth to reach project goals and develop personal growth.

In appreciation and support of the Lewis and Clark County 4-H program, the RON SCHATZ PROJECT AWARD will be an annual commitment. The Schatz family will submit \$600 to the Lewis and Clark County 4-H Leaders Council.

- Two (2) 4-H members will receive \$300

The recipient will use the funds to continue a project or to initiate a new project. Suggested ideas:

Project equipment (camera, sewing machine, bicycle, purchase of animal, tools, leashes), Materials to complete a project (wood, fabric, leather, tools, feed), Leadership and/or Self-determined project needs.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. A youth must enroll as a member for the current Lewis and Clark County 4-H program year.
2. A member who has been an active participant in the county 4-H program for a minimum of two (2) years. In the fall the 4-H,er will be headed into their 3rd year in 4-H.
3. A member that has at least one (1) year remaining in his/her 4-H career.

The recipients will be selected by a committee set up by the MSU Extension Office including a representative of the Schatz family prior to the October Awards Ceremony. No family member of an applicant will be on the selection committee.

Selection will be based on:

1. Number of years participating in the 4-H program and project.
2. Detailed explanation of how the award money will be used to benefit the project achievement by the member.
3. Organization Leader's letter of recommendation and support.
4. Project Superintendent's letter of recommendation and support.
 - a. If the club leader and/or project leader are immediate family please seek the letter(s) of recommendation from another adult that knows your project.
