Lewis and Clark County COVID-19 Restrictions

Governor's Order to Quarantine

Like the rest of the world, Lewis and Clark County is taking steps to protect the health of its residents and visitors from COVID-19. The County is enforcing a directive issued by Mont. Gov. Steve Bullock that requires anyone traveling into the state from another state or country to quarantine (stay home or in a hotel or other similar lodging) for 2 weeks.

This restriction does not apply to:

- people traveling within Montana
- people coming for essential work
- people traveling through Montana en route to another destination
- public health, public safety, or healthcare workers

Here's What Quarantine Means

- Stay home (or in a hotel or other similar facility) for 14 days;
- Keep at least 6 feet of separation from others (social distancing)
- Use a separate bathroom from anyone else staying at the same location who has tested positive for COVID-19; and
- Avoid sharing personal household items, like dishes, towels, and bedding.



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Symptoms of COVID-19

- Fever (over 100 degrees F.)
- Persistent cough
- Trouble breathing

And don't forget...



... for at least 20 seconds with soap and water
(or use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol)

If you develop any symptoms of illness while in Lewis and Clark County, stay home.

- If you are a county resident, call your local medical provider for guidance. Call ahead before going to the provider's office or an urgent care or emergency room.
- If you are NOT a county resident or do not have a medical provider, you may call PureView Health Center, 406-457-0000, or St. Peter's Health, 406-457-4180, 24/7.
