Establishing and Providing Services	Circle of Security classes have returned to in-person meetings. This promotes a warm atmosphere and is more conducive to the intimacy of the class. Support groups have also returned to an in-person setting.					
	LCPH Nurse Family Partnership Nurse Home Visitor has received two referrals for pregnant women who are incarcerated and coordinates services with 7Gen Home Visitor. The nurse home visitor will be able to continue providing specialized health home visits up until the baby turns two years old.
