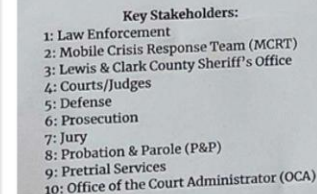

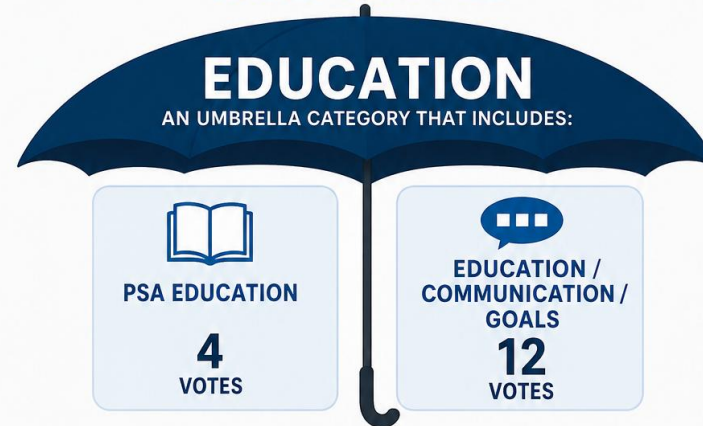

Additional Information

Law Enforcement & Jail

- Increase dispatch staffing
- Improve consistent use of citations
- Educate law enforcement and detention staff on pretrial services
- Explore LEAD
- Improve information-sharing regarding outstanding warrants
- **Process issue: More consistency, education, staffing, and information-sharing at the front end of the process**

Additional Information

Courts

- Better understand bond setting practices
- Promote consistency among judges
- Improve access to and coordination of court date information across counties
- Examine and establish appropriate case resolution timeframes
- **Process issue: More consistent decision-making**

Additional Information

Prosecution

- Examine the arrest-to-IA timeframe and opportunities to shorten it
- Review the timing of decisions to proceed with a case
- Consider speedy-trial/statutory changes
- Process issue: Reduce delays between arrest, prosecutorial review, charging/assignment, and the next stage of the case

Additional Information

Pretrial Services

- Develop clear, consistent approaches for responding to compliance and non-compliance
- Consider a step-down process that reduces supervision requirements for clients who consistently comply
- Improve systems for identifying and tracking court dates and required appearances across counties
- **Process issue: Allow supervision adjustments based on performance**

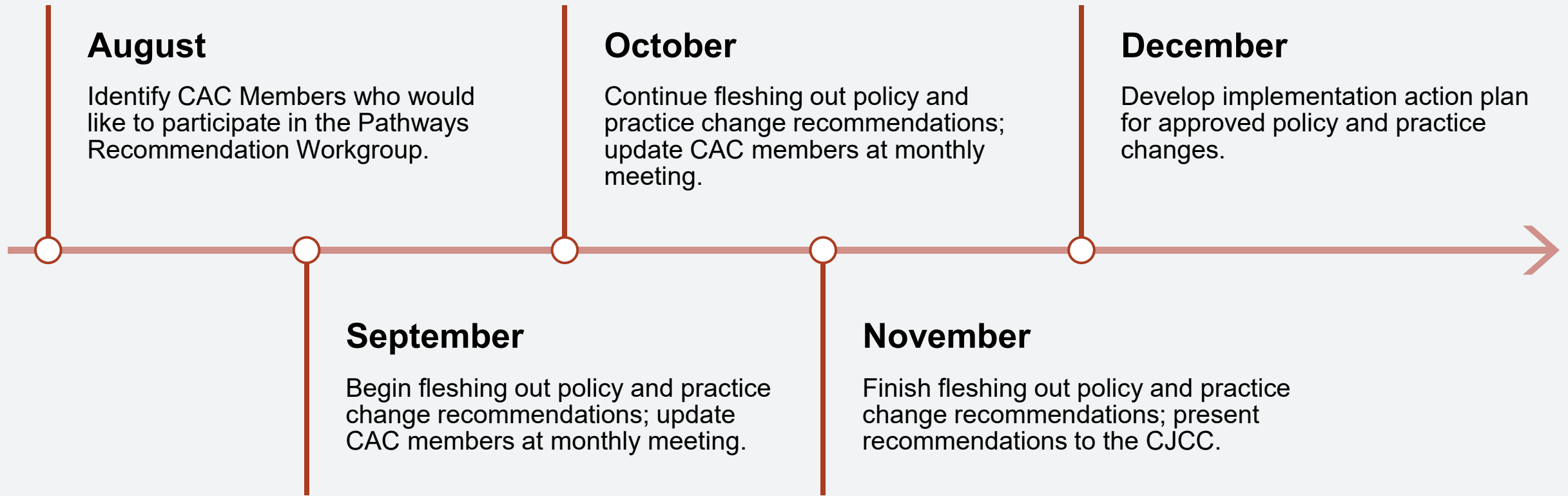
