- a. <u>Presentation Name</u> Evacuating and Shelters (Sue Hawthorne, Red Cross)
 - i. 12 year volunteer with Red Cross
 - ii. Help mainly after house fires with displaced occupants.
 - iii. They have a Disaster Action Team (DAT) to assist with large and small incidents across the country
 - iv. They can shelter pets if the specific shelter allows it. Larger animals are more challenging.
 - v. They have a Integrated Care Condolence Team (ICCT), for mental health and spiritual care and additional services.
 - vi. Provides preparedness training,
 - 1. PEDRO K to 2nd for basic emergency preparedness and how to take action when needed.
