- a. <u>Presentation Name</u> 83<sup>rd</sup> CST
  - i. WMD HAZMAT response responsibilities. Can do HAZMAT Identification
  - ii. 22 on staff, 17 are army, rest are air force
  - iii. Bomb techs are at Malmstrom
  - iv. They bring air monitoring equipment and can evaluate certain substances like drugs and other chemicals in trace amounts. They work a lot with the drug task force folks and utilize the FBI standards for identification.
  - v. They are federally funded and are self sustained.
  - vi. They have Decontanmination abilities as well as their own communications team
  - vii. They have a medical team with a Physicians Assistant, Medic and a scientist.
  - viii. Their work is presumptive but final diagnosis comes from utilization of a lab.
  - ix. They are free asset that supports but does not take over an incident.
  - x. Do a lot of training with other teams and agencies across the state.
  - xi. Reach out to them if you have any interest.
  - xii. They do troop training missions based on their needs and standards. They also do a version that meets the needs of the team they are working with.
  - xiii. Worked with DEA with drug lab work.
  - xiv. The process is to activate: Formal way is a number to their communications center (MTNG JOC 406-324-3000). The informal way is a direct call to them and they activate themselves for you.
  - xv. Will do event support (ie. Symphony under the stars, MSU and UM Football games)
  - xvi. Do have some equipment that they could loan for certain instances.
