# Helena Valley Growth Policy Briefing and Flood Plan Update

# Objective/Purpose:

- 1. To describe details about the Helena Valley Growth Policy to the VFC. Presentation provided by Director of L&C County Community Development and Planning Department.
- 2. Update VFC on progress toward implementing expanded McHugh ditch and cemetery diversion.

### Discussion

- Meeting began with Archie taking roll call. The sign-in sheet method for roll call was replaced with a member check-off list maintained by the committee coordinator; no longer will members/guests need to sign-in to our meetings. Guests' names attending VFC meeting were noted in lieu of signing a paper form.
- George Thebarge (Community Development and Planning Director) provided background information and explained some basic ideas about the Growth Policy in the context of population and development trends in Lewis & Clark County.
- According to the 2010 census, Helena's population is ca. 28,000; East Helena's population is ca. 2,000; and the Helena Valley population is ca. 24,000. Hence, our valley population is essentially a 2nd moderate sized community like the city of Helena.
- From 2000-2010 the valley experienced >5000 new homes built plus 1,000 platted lots!
- Currently about 98% of all development in the county occurs in the Helena Valley.
- Projections indicate this level of development and growth will continue through 2020—80% of growth expected outside of the cities.
- Current Helena Valley Growth Policy focuses on four key issues: 1) water supply, 2) wastewater disposal, 3) roads, and 4) fire protection.
- Valley citizens are strongly encouraged to get involved in the planning process.
- Archie responded on behalf of the VFC that the current growth policy misses an important issue:
  valley flooding, particularly in the Tenmile and Silver Creek study areas. He stressed that the Flood Mitigation Master Plan must be integral to the growth policy for the Helena Valley.
- **Eric Griffin** updated VFC about MDT's plan for reconfiguring the Forestvale-McHugh Intersection and Forestvale entrance for improving safety.
- County will coordinate with MDT for improvements at this intersection to include a new ditch crossing structure. Three 43" x 26" squash pipes won't meet requirements; hope is for an expanded box culvert under Forestvale at current intersection.
- An engineer will be hired to work out details of crossing design.
- Utility companies in planning stages poised for relocating utilities this spring/summer.
- Ground breaking activities for construction of the McHugh to cemetery leg of flood conveyance infrastructure expected this year. Work will progress from north to south along westside of McHugh.
- Questions at end of discussion circulated around funding available for implementing flood mitigation projects. This topic deferred for future meetings as time ran out.
