
# **FairEntry Information**



## **LCC 4-H Member Spotlight - Isabelle Lowry**

Whether it be a cattle, lamb, or hog show, when Isabelle Lowry's name is listed in the same class, exhibitors know they will need to bring their "A" game to have chance at the top spot. That is simply because Isabelle has built a solid reputation as a class-act showman - of three different species, mind you - across Montana, the Northwest and beyond. Such a reputation takes hours of hard work determination, and focus, vet Isabelle also displays a mastery of another important skill that is key to any success in life - goal setting.



4-H teaches all of us goal setting – the ins and outs of how to set a goal, the steps to take to achieve and everything in between. And, if there is a 4-Her who could clinic even the highest achieving adults on how to set a goal and achieve it, it is Isabelle. Most of us know of Isabelle's achievements within Lewis and Clark County 4-H – the numerous grand champion animals along with champion showman and high point awards in all 3 species – yet, her goals and success extend beyond 4-H and the show ring.

Outside of the ring, Isabelle is like many Montana kids and active in basketball and track. Anyone who has seen Isabelle run, knows the girl has speed, particularly in hurdles. During Isabelle's 8<sup>th</sup> grade year, she decided to take her speed to the next level by setting a goal to beat the school record at East Valley Middle School. And, guess what? She did. Not once, but twice. She also set a goal to walk the green carpet with her steer at the National Western in Denver and guess what? She did, winning her market class AND Intermediate Grand Showman this past January. AMAZING.

Oh, and she is also an honor-roll student, member of the first East Helena High School Girls basketball team and an active FFA member. Isabelle has also served on the 4-H Outdoor Committee as a junior superintendent and as her Club's secretary.

Sure, it would be easy to be envious of such a high-achieving individual and dismiss her accolades. Yet, the amazing thing about Isabelle is that she earns every ribbon, buckle, record and praise she gets the old-fashioned way – by setting a goal, laying out a plan, working hard, and stopping at nothing until the job is done. And, you know what else? She is willing to help anyone do the same. Many kids in Lewis and Clark County and beyond have benefited from Isabelle's wealth of knowledge and experience – whether it be in the barn, the show ring, the classroom, on the court, or on the track - she is always willing to lend a helping hand.

We are lucky Isabelle Lowry calls Lewis and Clark County home and look forward to seeing what else the future holds for this determined young woman.

Record book forms and/or project books need to be reviewed by project leaders to be eligible for Fair. Record book checks occur between **May 1**st and **June 10**th (unless otherwise stated by your project leaders).

## **Quality Assurance**

- All 4-H members (and a parent or guardian) enrolled in any livestock project, including breeding and dairy projects, must become certified through Animal Quality Assurance training.
  - o Livestock projects include: swine, goat, lamb, beef, rabbit, poultry, and dairy.
  - o You must attend this training if this is your first year raising a livestock animal
- There are no more in-person Quality Assurance trainings planned. To complete this requirement, please complete on of the following options:
  - a. Complete a training online for \$12 with the <u>Youth for the Quality Care of</u>
    Animals (YQCA). Provide the certificate to the Extension Office.
    - i. For instructions on how to create an account to take this online certification, please read these instructions.
  - b. Complete all four FREE modules <u>HERE</u>, print and provide certificates to the Extension Office.

Monday, June Next Pocket Pets project meeting is scheduled (In-Person) for Monday, June 15th, 2020, 6:30pm at Montana Wild. Bring your project books and Record book forms. Our meeting location in June will depend on whether Montana Wild re-opens to group meetings, so watch for email and text messages about Pocket Pets. Our goal will be to meet in person so that we can discuss and practice showmanship for the Fair.

Note that our scheduled meeting date June 15<sup>th</sup> is also the last day to submit entries for the Fair, and the Fair entry procedure this year is on-line (only). Pocket Pet project members can do showmanship with their pet (in or out of a cage, as needed for safety of the particular pet), they can exhibit a homemade pet treat with recipe, and/or they can do an educational exhibit (poster or other item). And everyone can do up to three exhibits in each of these categories. Check the 4-H Fair Book for details.

Pocket Pets had an on-line workshop meeting on Monday, May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Because project members have been enjoying more time with their Pocket Pets due to the stay-at-home order, our

discussion topic was Show and Tell. SHOW us your pet, where it lives in the house and TELL about what you have been doing with your pet and what you have done to Pet Proof the family home. For example, project member Taylin used a computer camera to show her gecko's terrarium and also to show that Thunder (her gecko) likes to climb on her shoulder.

WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS FOR THE POCKET PET PROJECT? Remember that we have used some time during most of our meetings to have each project member consider and write down their project goals, as well as what they did and what they learned at each monthly meeting. The information provided by each project member was transferred to the 4-H (non-animal) journal forms and provided back to each family. A reminder list of our workshop activities from last October through May has also been emailed to each family.


4-H SPORT FISHING is now in progress!

updated details about meeting locations. We will actively practice Social Distancing. In May we had two on-line workshops: FISH IDENTIFICATION and WHAT FISH EAT. We also had a Fishing Line and Casting workshop. We'll begin outdoor fishing in June, getting an introduction to stream, river, pond and lake fishing at numerous locations throughout the Helena area.

Sport Fishing Project Requirements: 1) Fishing gear: it's good if the 4-Her has their own fishing gear but please know that we do have fishing equipment available for those who don't have any; 2) project fee is \$15.00; 2) a medical information form must be completed for each project member (insurance, immunizations, doctor/dentist contact information); 3) 4-Her, all coaches, 4-H members and other family members present are required to wear Personal Flotation Devices (life jackets) when we are near or on the water; 4) project books have some good information but are NOT required for members attending the workshops.

WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS FOR THIS PROJECT? Just like in other projects this 4-H year, Sport Fishing project members are expected to complete a record book that journals their goals, record of workshops attended, what they did and what they learned at each workshop. Record books must be up-to-date and complete when reviewed for the 4-Her to enter an exhibit in the Fair for this project.

Information and assistance about how to complete your Record book forms is available weekly and we will have checked your record books at least once by June 10<sup>th</sup>. If you have any questions, contact Project Leader Guy Rainville at 439-3199 or contact the 4-H Office.



Record book pages (the 4-H Animal Project Journal and Financial Record) were emailed to each project member, along with a list of workshop activities and project book information that we have covered during 4-H vear 2019-2020. Please use the list of workshop activities as a guide to help you report in your record book when you attended a workshop, what you did at the workshop and then write down something that you learned at the workshop. Although it is likely our June workshop will be in person, our meetings will continue to depend on public and 4-H guidelines. Please watch for emails and text messages with updates.

FAIR: Our 4-H Fair will take place! Monday, June 15, is the deadline to submit entries for the Fair. Please note that the Fair entry process this year is on-line (only). Poultry project members can sign up to enter their Poultry, one meat pen, do showmanship, enter an educational display, and can enter a half dozen eggs exhibit. If this is your first year doing 4-H Poultry Showmanship at our 4-H Fair, even if you have done Open Class previously, enter Showmanship in the Novice level. All Poultry entered into the Fair will be cage judged. Check the 4-H Fair Book for details and the time schedule.

Our **Fair Poultry Show will be at 6:00 pm on Wednesday, July 22, 2020.** This is when Poultry Showmanship takes place and each project member must be present and on-time. See Fair Book for the Poultry DRESS CODE – it is not the same as recent changes adopted by other county 4-H Livestock Divisions. Our Poultry Show requirement is: "Plain white button-up collared shirt (long or short sleeved, not sleeveless), dark pants (not yoga pants or leggings), and black tie are required for both the show and sale. Hard soled shoes or boots are recommended for safety. No flip flops or sandals." DON'T WAIT UNTIL JUST BEFORE FAIR; BEGIN ASSEMBLING YOUR FAIR CLOTHING NOW.

Our May workshop was on Saturday, May 9<sup>th</sup> On-Line, Facebook Live. A recording of the workshop is accessible on our group Facebook page (April workshop is also accessible there). Many Poultry project members have seen the videos. If you have not yet watched, and do not do Facebook, please message us.

For the May 9, 2020, workshop – the material for project level one members is pages 30 through 33, "Starring in Showmanship", of Poultry Project Book level one ("Scratching the Surface"). These pages provide information and examples about showmanship. The judge we will have at our 4-H Fair prefers to watch the project member remove their bird from its cage. So be sure to practice this with the bird you intend to use for showmanship. The more you practice, the easier and more relaxing it will become for both the bird and the 4-Her. Next, practice holding your bird. Hold the bird with your hand against the underside and fingers placed to gently control it; feel the bird's keel bone pretty much centered in the palm of your hand. In the May workshop video, Junior Superintendents Irene and Ashton demonstrate how to show and describe the bird's parts for the judge. Start at either end of the bird and work your way to the other end. In one of the photos you can see Aston spreading his bird's wing as he would describe it and the feathers to a judge. A useful list of "Bird Words" poultry body parts is on pages 34 and 35 of Poultry Project Book level one ("Scratching the Surface").

The level 2 activity for the May meeting was "Telling Layers from Liars" on pages 18 and 19 of the 4-H Poultry Project Book level two ("Testing Your Wings"). These pages provide guidelines for examining a bird to determine if the bird is likely to be a healthy egg layer. In the workshop video there is shown an example of how the vent of a non-layer appears (this was a young bird). There is also shown an example of how the vent looks on a hen that is an active egg layer. Additionally, you can see in one of the photos how Irene is holding her hen such that the bird's vent would easily be visible to a judge while that part of the bird is described during Poultry Showmanship. Look at the Project Book level two illustration provided: is this hen a liar or a layer?


