
Junior Superintendents Needed!

LCC 4-H Volunteer Spotlight - Denice Harris

The Lewis and Clark County 4H program has benefitted from the dedication and commitment of program volunteer Denice Harris who has worn many hats from supportive parent of two active and committed 4Hers, club leader for the Golden Livestock 4H Club and 4H Council Vice President for two consecutive terms. For Harris the passion and commitment to 4H is deeply rooted as she is a 10 year veteran of 4H herself where she was a member of clubs in both Great Falls and Townsend during her youth.

Raised on registered Angus cattle ranches in both Belt and Townsend, cattle quickly became a way of life for Harris and her family. She assisted her family with ranch duties and daily care of a herd of Angus cattle and began showing steers in her front yard even before she was old enough to her



steers in her front yard even before she was old enough to be considered a 4Her and enter the show ring. As a first year 4Her Harris diligently applied her skills gained on the ranch and fed and worked with a steer that earned the honor of Grand Champion Market Steer at State Fair in Great Falls. During her first 5 years in 4H Harris and her steers received Grand Champion honors 3 times. Although she enjoyed her personal success she also gained a lot of satisfaction from helping mentor other 4H youth holding clinics to teach other members how to raise, care for and fit their cattle for show.

For several years she was an active member in the Montana Junior Angus Association where she continued both her passion for the breed and showing cattle before graduating and heading off to college at MSU. At MSU Harris earned an ag communications degree with a minor in animal science. Today Harris carries her commitment to agriculture and dedication to successful livestock projects forward to support not only her own daughters who are passionate and gifted sheep showmen but to all the youth members of Lewis and Clark County 4H.

While serving as Vice President of 4H Council Harris spearheaded efforts with youth members to grow the 4H livestock auction and engage with existing and new buyers of quality 4H livestock animals offered for sale at fair. The group developed a web page to promote the livestock sale and met with community business leaders to garner feedback to help them work to make the livestock auction stronger than ever for benefit of all 4H youth. For both Harris and the youth members involved much of this work has been behind the scenes and with little recognition which is just how Harris was raised to have it. 4H experiences have shaped Harris into an ambitious and successful business woman, mother and committed volunteer that Lewis and Clark County is blessed to have. Time with family and enjoying MSU Bobcats football games is her favorite hobby and how Harris spends her free time.

While juggling parenting and her role as a leader for the Golden Livestock 4H Club, Harris achieved her MBA from Auburn University in 2018. Since that time and while serving as a volunteer Harris accepted a position as Vice President of Marketing for Thrivent Financial. Her responsibilities include a region encompassing the states of Montana, Idaho, and Washington. All the while she has not simply maintained her role as a volunteer in Lewis and Clark County 4H but has taken every opportunity in front of her to expand her involvement for the benefit of the members of our program.

LCC 4-H Member Spotlight - August Schneider

August started his 4-H journey at the age of nine (9) in the 2012/2013 4-H year. His first project was Archery and Discovering 4-H. He attended all the Club meetings and entered an Archery & Discovering 4-H Exhibit in the Fair. He also entered Grand Foods and gave a demonstration & illustrated talk at the club.

2013/2014 year had August taking Archery and Gardening. He participated in window display for 4-H week along with helping with the food baskets for Thanksgiving. August was active in school with swim meets, Drum Circle, Teacher's assistant, Talent Show and Piano. In church he was in AWANA, he gave piano recitals at Touch mark and Church.

In June of 2013 the family moved to Alexandria, Virginia where August and his family were able to take in the Smithsonian Zoo, the National Archives, the Mount Vernon Department of Printing & Engraving, the Air & Space Museums, the Museum of Natural History, the American History Museum, the Arlington Cemetery, the Eternal Flame and the Tomb



of the Unknown Soldier and the Changing of the Guard. He saw the Washington Monument, the Lincoln Memorial, the Jefferson Memorial, the FDR Memorial, The Martin Luther King Memorial, Vietnam War Memorial, Korea War Memorial and the World War II Memorial. After seeing all of this August said, "I miss Montana and my Club but plan to join 4-H in Virginia and come back to Montana with lots of stories". When they returned to Montana August got back into the club routine as if he had never left.

This time (2015/2016) he added two market projects, swine & goat, along with cake decorating and robotics. August was elected as club treasurer. He helped with window display, club service projects, gave his demonstrations and entered the projects in the fair.

In 2016/2017 he had a market swine and a woodworking project. He again helped with Christmas gift wrapping, window display Grand Foods and all the other activities within the club, a well as being club treasurer again.

August's 5th year (2017/2018) saw him taking Market Swine, Market Goat and Woodworking. He was aging taking part in all the realms of the club. He was also a 4-H camp counselor, Club Vice- President, Freshman Class secretary and CHS Robotics club. He also performed at the piano for music Festivals. He was very active in school and 4-H.

This year (2018/2019) August took a Market Swine Project along with Teen Leadership, Baking 103 and Woodworking, as you can see, he kind of likes his pigs. In school August was Sophomore Class Vice-President and was in Science club. In 4-H August was Club Vice-President, 4-H Camp Counselor and Junior Swine Superintendent. As Vice-President he led some meetings, gave 3 demonstrations. He also took a Mission Trip to Guatemala.

This past year (2019/2020) August's projects included Market Swine, Teen Leadership, Baking 104 and Woodworking. He was voted in as Club President, where he has done an

excellent job in running the meetings. He again helped with window displays and Beef Tagging and was a camp counselor. Attended Grand Foods and made a bread that was Grand Champion. In school August was Class Vice-President and was Youth Group Student Leader in his church

So Far August has won many, Grand and Reserve Champion ribbons, along with Purple, Blue & Red ribbons. At the beginning of his 4-H journey August asked a lot of questions and is now able to answer those same questions as he has grown in 4-H. He has done an excellent job with his record book which made the writing of this article easy. He is an outstanding youth representative to our 4-H program and it has been a pleasure to be his club leader through his journey.

Sewing students - please come prepared: Prewash your fabrics before cutting out pattern If comfortable, cut the patterns prior to the workshop as there is limited space Know your sewing machine - how to thread and rewind a bobbin, using the foot pedal Minimum sewing supplies to have handy are: T Scissors - preferably shears T Dressmaker pins or quilting pins T Pin cushion T Seam ripper T 6" ruler T Seam gauge T Measuring tape T Marking pencil/pen T Sewing machine (if you don't have one, we have one or two machines to share)

Knitting, crochet, embroidery and weaving this is also a time for these projects.

Knitting - bring your own needles and yarn; crochet - crochet hook and yarn; embroidery - embroidery thread, hoop and material; weaving - yarn or thread for your project.

Trying to select a fun 4-H project? ENROLL IN 4-H SPORT FISHING! This year's project will begin in **April 2021 with meetings every Tuesday evening until mid-August.** Our weekly meetings will include workshop topics such as fishing knots, Montana fishing regulations, fish identification, rod & reel maintenance and casting practice. Project

members will begin outdoor fishing in May, getting an introduction to stream, river, pond and lake fishing at numerous locations throughout the Helena area.

The Sport Fishing project of 4-H introduces beginning fishers to the sport while challenging the more advanced fishers. It is also about learning and enjoying the treasure we call the Montana outdoors. Notably, all project members, volunteers and family members are required to wear PFDs (personal flotation devices "life jackets") when in or near the water. There is an additional fee to participate in this project; however, project books are not required.

FISHING TIP: When you catch a fish, you need to be able to know what you caught. A handy guide to help you identify your fish can be found in the Montana Fishing Regulations. You will find both pictures and information to assist you. Check out the photo with this article. What kind of fish did Garrison catch?

The fish is a Brown Trout. Its identifying features are: Background color usually golden brown Tail fin squarish with few spots or none Black or brown spots often with light halos Red or orange spots on sides with light halos




Photo by Gary Edwards: Project member Garrison enjoying fishing success on Hauser Lake. September 2020.

The average size of a Brown Trout is 12-14 inches in length. It ranges throughout southwestern Montana and can also be found near Missoula, Great Falls and around Havre (and of course, near Helena). An interesting fact about this particular fish is that Brown Trout are non-native to Montana.
