Pocket Pets project workshops are now done for this 4-H year. Our final workshop was on Monday, June 28th, 2021, in Montana Wild. We talked about Fair and discussed care of our Pocket Pets during the summer weather and during family travel. We reviewed nutritional needs of each project member's pet.

Because we do have some project members participating in this project and/or other projects at Fair, we discussed and



practiced showmanship as to their pets. We also discussed how you should dress for judging, how to introduce yourself (and your pet) and any other exhibit to a judge. As to pets, be prepared to discuss why and how you got your pet, how you take care of them, what they live in at your house, what they eat, how long they will live and what your future plans are for both you and your pet. Showmanship of animals typically also includes being able to identify body parts of your pet.

Pocket Pets should be brought to the Fair in an escape-proof cage. These pets will not remain at the Fair after judging. However, any educational display posters or snacks exhibited and judged will remain at the Fair (until Sunday morning, August 1<sup>st</sup>). Photos of any pet exhibited can also be displayed during the Fair in the Pocket Pets project area.

Although Record Books have already been reviewed by project leader C.J., 4-Hers are reminded to continue journaling your Pocket Pets related activities in your Record Book until it is submitted to your club leader – Record Books are due to your club leader on August 30<sup>th</sup>.

**4-H SPORT FISHING** season 2021 has weekly Tuesday evening workshops that will continue during the Fair and into August. We meet each Tuesday evening at 6:00 pm outside at various water locations in the Helena area. If you are interested in this project, you may still come join the group. Contact project leader Guy Rainville at 439-3199. Project members, please watch for emails and text messages with updated details about workshop locations. Because we are outside for our workshops, weather might impact our schedule and locations.



In June we had Sport Fishing workshops in several locations. First, we met at Spring Meadow Lake to learn about the importance of wearing PFDs (personal flotation devices), often referred to as life jackets. We also discussed what fish might be found in this lake and the fishing regulations applicable to this water. After our lesson, everyone had the opportunity to fish. Next, we fished at the Causeway. At that location two different bodies of water are separated by a small roadway. This is important because each body of water (Hauser Reservoir and Lake Helena) may have different regulations that apply, however in this case they did not – remember to check the 2021 Montana Fishing Regulations. At this location project members were doing bank fishing.

In the middle of June, our Sport Fishing group fished at a private pond along Highway 12 West. To fish at a private pond, or to cross private property to get to water, you must first contact the property owner and get permission. You must also follow any special requirements provided by the landowner. For example, fishing at this private pond was catch and release. However, the landowner allows fishers who are nine years old or younger to keep one fish. Also, if anyone catches a brown trout (one was caught during our evening) – that fish does not get released back into the water because the brown trout is a predator. Later in June at a workshop, we welcomed guest presenter Ryan Schmaltz of the Montana Wild Education Center. He led and taught us about finding, netting and collecting underwater wildlife that fish eat. Knowing this type of information will help us in selecting bait, lures or flies when we go fishing.

In July and August, we plan to continue outdoor fishing [dependent on the weather]. Project members will be introduced to more fishing opportunities at numerous locations throughout the Helena area.

Sport Fishing Project Requirements: 1) Fishing gear: it's good if the 4-Her has their own fishing gear but please know that we do have fishing equipment available for those who don't have any; 2) project fee is \$15.00; 2) a medical information form must be completed for each project member (insurance, immunizations, doctor/dentist contact information); 3) 4-Her, all coaches, 4-H members and other family members present are required to wear Personal Flotation Devices (life jackets) when we are near or on the water; 4) project books have some good information but are NOT required for members attending the workshops.

WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS FOR THIS PROJECT? Just like in other projects this 4-H year, Sport Fishing project members are expected to complete a record book that journals their goals, record of workshops attended, what they did and what they learned at each workshop. Record books were reviewed by project leader Guy in May and June. Remember that your Record Book is due to your club leader by August 30<sup>th</sup>. Continue journaling your Sport Fishing project related activities in your Record Book until submitted to the club leader.

#### FISHING TIP for July / August:

Sharp hooks help with hook penetration and catching more fish. There is an easy way to determine if a hook is sharp. Gently draw the hook point across a fingernail. If the point digs in and leaves a mark, it's sharp. If the hook doesn't leave a mark or dig in, it needs to be sharpened.

A small file or sharpening stone will work to sharpen your hooks. Always use a lubricant on the sharpener, saliva will work well. Firmly hold the hook, drawing it point first across the sharpener. After a few strokes check the hook on your fingernail (see above). Continue to sharpen the hook until it is sharp. Always handle sharp hooks with care.

Information that will help all Poultry project members be ready for Fair and other Poultry events can be found on pages 30 – 33, "Starring in Showmanship" of the level one Poultry book. These pages provide information and examples about showmanship. Be sure to practice handling your bird and practice your showmanship skills. The more you practice, the more comfortable both you and your bird will be when comes time for our Fair Poultry Show.

Important at this workshop was bird handling practice, showmanship, and reviewing with the project members what kind of bird they have in front of them. Be prepared to answer that question for the judge. Maybe the judge will ask about the bird of the person showing next to you. Be sure to review and be familiar with the Bird Words glossary on page 34 of the level one project book. Level 2 project members should also be familiar with the terms listed and defined in Bird Talk 2 on page 34 of the level two project book.

There was discussion and review about dusting poultry. Remember that you never dust meat birds. If you need some guidance on dusting procedures, contact C.J. and Lexie.

Poultry will be displayed this year in the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building. Unlike in 2020, all birds will remain at the Fairgrounds during the entire Fair (until tear down on Sunday – except for birds sold at auction if buyer wants to take on Saturday). Project members are responsible for daily care of their birds. **We will set up our area on Sunday, July 25th beginning at 9:00 am.** All project members are expected to come assist with set-up. Recommend you wear work gloves. Parents who are helping are also urged to wear work gloves and bring small tools such as pliers. Battery powered drills would be useful too.

Poultry is scheduled to come into the BHB between 2:00 pm and 6:00 pm on Tuesday, July 27<sup>th</sup> (as scheduled in Fair book). All Poultry entered into the Fair will be cage judged. Project members are not required to be present during the cage judging.

**Our 4-H Fair Poultry Show will be in the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building at 6:00 pm on Wednesday, July 28, 2021**, and that is when Poultry Showmanship takes place. Each project member signed up for showmanship must be present and on-time. See Fair Book for the Poultry DRESS CODE (page 41). Our Poultry Dress Code is not the same as the other county 4-H Livestock Divisions. It is: "Plain white button-up collared shirt (long or short sleeved, not sleeveless), dark pants (not yoga pants or leggings), and black tie are required for both the show and sale. Hard soled shoes or boots are recommended for safety. No flip flops or sandals." DON'T WAIT UNTIL THE DAY BEFORE FAIR TO ASSEMBLE YOUR FAIR CLOTHING.

We will begin tear down of the Poultry display area at 7:00 am on Sunday, August 1<sup>st</sup>.
