Montana 4-H Congress events are scheduled for July 13-16, 2021, in person at MSU Bozeman. Registration is Open! Hurry! **Registration deadline for 4-H summer camp is June 4.** Your camp counselors have an outstanding schedule planned, full of activities, games, workshops, outdoor recreation, and summer fun. This is a one-day camp in Helena on Thursday, June 17. Our second camp will be Thursday, July 22, and this will be a "bring a friend" camp, welcoming non-4-H kids in the community to attend and learn what 4-H is all about. We'll cap this off with a 4-H only overnight camp on August 5 & 6. Depending on attendance and capacity, we may open a second registration deadline for the July and August camps.

The dates for camp are **June 17 (day camp, \$30), July 22 (day camp, \$30) and August 5 & 6 (overnight camp, \$40).** Fee includes transportation, accommodations, meals, activity supplies and a tee-shirt.

Quality Assurance Committee

Anyone enrolled in an animal project (other than horse, dog, cat, and pocket pets) is required to complete Quality Assurance training once every three years, DUE MAY 1ST. You can even find him in the poultry area during fair helping set up and tear down. He is there to support his grandkids and all the 4-Hers with their projects.


Guy's passion for shooting sports and fishing makes him a true asset to our county.


LCC 4-H Spotlight Member- Elaina Patten

This is also an opportunity to talk about what you would like to display, and how to use what we have learned this year to present your images in the best way possible.

Our final Pocket Pets workshop before Fair will be on Monday, June 28th, 2021, at 6:30 pm in Montana Wild. Please watch for texts and emails to confirm location of the meeting.

At our May 24th, 2021 workshop, we enjoyed a presentation by 4-H volunteer Vanessa Olson and her daughter Clancy. Vanessa was previously a leader for the Pocket Pets project. Vanessa and Clancy introduced us to their two chinchillas, Carmen and Charlie. Both chinchillas are about 8 years old. They got Charlie first; he was around a year old when his first family decided not to keep him and returned him to the pet store where the Olson family found him. Around a year later the Olson family welcomed

Carmen. Charlie had done fairly well alone, but has gotten along well with Carmen.

Vanessa and Clancy shared some chinchilla facts: chinchillas do need things to chew on because their teeth continue to grow. They cannot have much fruit due to the sugar in the fruit. Carmen and Charlie do get an occasional yogurt snack. Chinchillas can be affectionate and we saw that Charlie seemed to like to cuddle. Vanessa reported that caring for them is relatively easy, they live indoors, they don't do well in heat. You do need to keep an eye on how much they chew into their own little home. Chinchillas cost around \$150 and live to be 10 – 20 years old.

Next at the May Workshop, we discussed entering Pocket Pet exhibits into the upcoming Fair. Project members can show up to three Pocket Pets, all the same or different species of animals. They can also enter educational exhibits, such as posters. Finally, project

members can enter pet snacks that demonstrate how they provide good nutrition to their pets.

Next, we had a short review about how to complete Record Book pages and the "why" of doing 4-H Record Books. We reviewed a Record Book sample and a list of workshop activities from this year that has been sent out to each Pocket Pets family. Project members were reminded that Record Books must be reviewed for the Fair no later than June 10th. Pocket Pets project members' Record Books still needing review can be checked via on-line / email provided to the project leader.

Our final activity was discussing how to do basic showmanship with Pocket Pets. Be prepared to tell your judge all about your pet. Just as Vanessa and Clancy told us about chinchillas this evening, be prepared to introduce your pet, tell its age, tell how you got it, tell what you do to take care of it, its diet, and about the time you spend with your pet. Some Pocket Pets such as most fish cannot easily be exhibited in person at the Fair. So, consider what type of educational display could help your judge to experience your pet if it cannot be brought to the Fair. 4-Hers should spend time with their pets and spend time handling them so that the pets will feel safe and comfortable when they come to the Fair. Spending time with their Pocket Pet and handling and holding the Pocket Pet will also give the 4-Her a feeling of comfort and confidence.

Pocket Pet project members: bring a Pocket Pet to the June workshop for practice showmanship. If your pet is one that cannot come to the workshop, plan to use a photo to talk about your pet.



Rod Care & Maintenance: examine rod guides for scratches. One method is to run a nylon stocking through the guides to see if it snags. Repair or replace damaged guides promptly.

Reel Maintenance: remove the spool assembly to do inspection and clean both the exterior and interior of the reel with cotton swabs and isopropyl alcohol. Then lightly oil roller assemblies and drive gear bearings.

<u>Fishing Line</u>: 4-H Sport Fishing gives project members the opportunity to have fresh 8 pound monofilament line installed onto their reels. Replacement line is a good way to get ready for a new fishing season.

Regular maintenance and safe storage are recommended for fishing rods and reels. Use a good rack system to keep your rod off the floor and out of harm's way. Don't leave your rod leaning against a wall or in a corner. You might get an unwanted bend over time.

outside for our workshops, weather might impact our schedule and locations.

In May we had three Sport Fishing workshops at the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building. First, we had classes on the 2021 Fishing Regulations and Fish Identification. Next, we did maintenance on our rods and reels. Finally, we had casting training and practice. We plan to be doing outdoor fishing in June [dependent on the weather]. Project members will be introduced to stream, river, pond and lake fishing at numerous locations throughout the Helena area.

Sport Fishing Project Requirements: 1) Fishing gear: it's good if the 4-Her has their own fishing gear but please know that we do have fishing equipment available for those who don't have any; 2) project fee is \$15.00; 2) a medical information form must be completed for each project member (insurance, immunizations, doctor/dentist contact information); 3) 4-Her, all coaches, 4-H members and other family members present are required to wear Personal Flotation Devices (life jackets) when we are near or on the water; 4) project books have some good information but are NOT required for members attending the workshops.

WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS FOR THIS PROJECT? Just like in other projects this 4-H year, Sport Fishing project members are expected to complete a record book that journals their goals, record of workshops attended, what they did and what they learned at each workshop. Record books must be up-to-date and complete when reviewed for the 4-Her to enter an exhibit in the Fair for this project.

Remember that project books are not required if only participating in the weekly workshops. At this point your Record Book pages should list your three project goals, that you have spent \$15.00 for a project fee, and list which workshops you have attended, along with something that you have learned at each workshop. If you have spent additional funds for new fishing equipment or have gone fishing with family or friends, list that also. A photo can be included on the first page of your Record Book materials, and additional pages with photos are a good way to journal your fishing activities this season.

Information and assistance about how to complete your Record book forms is available weekly and we must check your record books by June 10th. Record Books can be checked at one of our project workshops on Tuesdays, May 25th or June 1st or June 8th; at the all project Record Books Review on Wednesday, May 26th, 6:30 pm at the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building, or by providing it to us through email to siege4214@gmail.com, or even by completing your pages in 4h.zsuite.org – the same on-line location that you have used to enroll in 4-H this year and sign up for Sport Fishing. Rocks, shore lines, holes, boulders, stumps, weeds, sunken trees, logs, debris, overhanging banks, bushes or trees -- all provide these necessities and attract fish.

The Poultry May workshop was on Saturday, May 1st at the BHB. Level One project members did pages 26 & 27 of Poultry Project Book level one ("Scratching the Surface") that had them working on a section called "A Bird in the Hand." This

chapter looks at how to keep your bird safe and comfortable, thus reducing the

stress on both of you. "It just makes sense:

being able to handle birds properly and safely is

critical to being a good poultry raiser. Whether you are showing, bathing, examining, judging or grooming birds, you need to know how to keep you and your bird safe and comfortable." (page 26). This chapter also provides guidance for an important 4-H Fair situation. In order to be judged at a Poultry Show, you must be able to comfortably and safely remove your bird from, and return it to its cage. One key tip is to bring the bird out headfirst and also return it to the cage headfirst. Remember that "the more you handle a bird and practice removing it from a cage safely and quietly, the more it will grow to trust you and the less stress it will experience." ((page 27). You the showman will also grow more comfortable and confident.

Level Two project members worked through "Telling Layers from Liars" on pages 18 and 19 of the 4-H Poultry Project Book level two ("Testing Your Wings"). These pages provide guidelines for examining a bird to determine if the bird is likely to be a healthy egg layer. "Identifying female chickens with superior egg production characteristics is critical to the success of an egg production enterprise. By checking certain body characteristics and handling qualities such as abdominal capacity, plumage, head and body parts, you will be able to maintain a productive flock." (page 18). "Your best layers will have large, bright red combs and wattles." (page 19).

Next at this workshop was bird handling, practice showmanship, and reviewing with the project members what kind of bird they have. It is a question that a poultry judge might ask. The judge might even ask about the bird of the person showing next to you. Be sure to review and be familiar with the Bird Words glossary on page 34 of the level one project book.

Project members! Remember that as of Saturday, May 1st you needed to have possession of any Poultry that you might enter into the Fair.

Record Book review began for all projects on May 1st and will be completed no later than June 10th in order to participate in the Fair. To accomplish this, provide your Record Book

to the project leaders on-line, email or in-person. Your Record Book pages should include information about what you have worked through in your project book.
