Hello photographers, I'm excited to announce the 2021 Lewis & Clark County Annual 4-H Photo Show!

This year in the Photography project we have been focusing on the creative process and exploring different styles of photography. The Photo Show format is going to reflect that approach. There will be no live interview judging for this year's event. Instead judging score will be determined by the photo entry and the written responses supplied by the registrants. Photographers will express their creative process and what they learned as a percentage of their judging score.

Next Pocket Pets workshop is scheduled for Monday, May 24th, 2021, at 6:30 pm in Montana Wild. Please watch for texts and emails to confirm location of the meeting.

At our April 26th, 2021 workshop, we were visited by community member Kasha Schultz and some of her many wonderful Pocket Pets. Kasha shared with us several different geckos, and a hairless guinea pig [known as a skinny pig] with its baby. Project members

got the opportunity to touch the geckos and the mama skinny pig. We also learned some information from Kasha about their needed living environments, eating requirements and social habits. An interesting fact is that if a gecko loses its tail, it will grow another one. The new tail will not be as long and slender as the first; it might even look a lot like the gecko has a second head.

While Kasha brought several pets to share with us, it should be noted that for each pet's safety and well-being, most of the pets came in separate housing. Just because pets live together in the same home – separation may be required between different species. Separation may also be required between the same species of pet, as not all pets are social. Guinea pigs, for example, do well with a companion guinea pig. But some other animals, such as bearded dragons, tend to want to be alone and away from other bearded dragons most of the time.

Next, we had a Show and Tell presentation. One of our Project members brought in her Pocket Pet corn snake. She told us about her snake's diet – a main food is small mice. She reports that her snake will get to be three to four feet long and live 15 – 30 years.

Project members had an assignment for this workshop to provide a photo of their pet that we could share as an entire group. As we reviewed the photos that were submitted, project members were reminded that the Lewis and Clark 4-H County Photo Show is coming – and Pocket Pets provide interesting subject matter for pictures. Photos may be submitted for the Photo Show from May 1st to May 14th. You don't have to be in the Photography project to participate – all county 4-Hers may enter the Show. There will be no in-person or on-line judging interviews. Project members may submit one photo of their pet or whatever else that interests them into the Photo Show. One photo only. The entry form asks three questions to be answered about why the entered photo was chosen and what it means to you, description of what you did to set up the photo, and what did you learn from doing the photo. See the county website for details or contact your Pocket Pets leader for assistance.

Before the workshop ended, project members were given a few moments to write down information about this workshop in their draft project Record Book pages. We also had a short review about what the Record Book pages actually look like and how to complete them, along with the "why" of doing 4-H Record Books. *Project members were reminded that Record Books must be reviewed for the Fair no later than June 10th. Pocket Pets project members' Record Books can be reviewed at the May 24th workshop, on Wednesday evening, May 26th during an all-project review at the BHB, or on-line / email provided to the project leader.* Guidelines and examples will be emailed to each Pocket Pets member in early May. Contact your project leader if you have any questions.

Please watch for emails and text messages with updated details about meeting locations. Once we move outside for our workshops, weather might impact our schedule and locations. In April we had two Sport Fishing workshops at the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building: Signups plus popcorn and a movie: The Underwater World of Trout / Discovery. If you are interested in seeing this video or watching it again, type into your search browser on your computer: "The Underwater World of Trout Part One - Discovery" and the You

Tube video should be accessible to you. There are two companion videos if you are interested; you could access them the same way. They are: "The Underwater World of Trout Part Two – Feeding Lies" and "The Underwater World of Trout Part Three – Trout Vision." Our second workshop had project members learning and practicing Fishing Knots that they will be using when fishing. We plan to begin outdoor fishing in May [dependent on the weather]. Project members will be introduced to stream, river, pond and lake fishing at numerous locations throughout the Helena area.

Sport Fishing Project Requirements: 1) Fishing gear: it's good if the 4-Her has their own fishing gear but please know that we do have fishing equipment available for those who don't have any; 2) project fee is \$15.00; 2) a medical information form must be completed for each project member (insurance, immunizations, doctor/dentist contact information); 3) 4-Her, all coaches, 4-H members and other family members present are required to wear Personal Flotation Devices (life jackets) when we are near or on the water; 4) project books have some good information but are NOT required for members attending the workshops.

WHAT ARE YOUR GOALS FOR THIS PROJECT? Just like in other projects this 4-H year, Sport Fishing project members are expected to complete a record book that journals their goals, record of workshops attended, what they did and what they learned at each workshop. Record books must be up-to-date and complete when reviewed for the 4-Her to enter an exhibit in the Fair for this project.

Information and assistance about how to complete your Record book forms is available weekly and we will check your record books by June 10th. If you have any questions, contact Project Leader Guy Rainville at 439-3199 or contact the 4-H Office.

MAY Fishing Tip: While fishing, always examine your lure to make sure that it is free from weeds or other debris. This is especially important when you are trolling or casting in weedy areas or down deep where your lure nears the bottom often. Reel in your lure at regular intervals and look it over; a fish won't bite a lure which has any weeds fouled around it.

Next Poultry Workshop: Saturday, May 1st, 2021, at 1:00 pm in the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building BHB. Bring your project book. Bring a bird - we now practice Showmanship at every workshop.

The Poultry April workshop was on Saturday, April 3rd at the BHB. Our workshop began with a presentation by Level Two member Aliza Jane that she had entered into Communications Day as a Prepared Speech. Her topic was Chicken Combs. The information she provided included discussion about the size of combs and how that relates to climate where the bird lives. Level One project members did pages 24 & 25 of Poultry Project Book level one ("Scratching the Surface") that had them working on a section called "Chicken Feed." This chapter looks at feed ingredients and nutrients appropriate for poultry. Level Two project members worked through "Bony Bird" on pages 14 & 15 of the 4-H Poultry Project Book level two ("Testing Your Wings"). This chapter considers the skeletons of birds and why birds can fly. This month, each level two member gave a short workshop presentation about two poultry breeds that they have not previously shown.

Next was this month's Showmanship practice. Both project levels presented for practice judging with their birds. WHAT might a poultry judge ask? In Showmanship you need to be able to tell the judge all about your bird and you might even be asked a question about a bird of the person showing next to you. Be sure to review and be familiar with the Bird Words glossary on page 34 of the level one project book.

Project members! Remember that Saturday, May 1st is an important deadline for your Poultry project. As of May 1st, you must have possession of any Poultry that you might enter into the Fair.

Record Book review is coming. Record Books for all projects can be reviewed beginning May 1st and must be reviewed by a project leader no later than June 10th in order to

participate in the Fair. Information will be emailed to each family concerning Record Book review and the Poultry project.

Level one Poultry project members: for the May workshop, be prepared to talk about two birds that you do not own. Be able to tell their Breed and their Variety. Also, what is their purpose?
