

In July and August, we had Sport Fishing workshops in several outdoor locations. We met at Spring Meadow Lake to do warm water fishing, we did river fishing on the Little Blackfoot River (west side of McDonald Pass), and we did trolling from boats that launched from White

Sandy Campground (Helena north valley area), We also did arctic lake fishing at Park Lake (above Clancy) and returned to Spring Meadow Lake to learn to

trust in our PFDs (personal flotation devices / life jackets) during a practical exercise in which project members are tipped out of small boats into the water where they return to the surface due to their PFDs. This way they know they will surface safely should they fall into water for any reason when they are wearing their life jackets. In mid-August we revisited a private pond close to Helena where project members enjoyed successful catches.

FISHING TIP for September:

A beginner in fishing is better off if he (or she) carries only 1 or 2 lures and uses them constantly until being able to work them effectively. Later the beginner can add other lures and learn how to use them. Experienced fisherpersons, of course, should carry a wide assortment of lures and know how to use most of them.




As an end of year party, club members met at the Flying Giant Adventure Park. The group enjoyed pizza and ice cream to celebrate all the accomplishments throughout the year.
