What do Pocket Pets feel like? Enroll in this fun project and you will find out! Our next workshop is scheduled for Monday, February 28th, 2022, at 6:00 pm in the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building BHB at the Fairgrounds. Come and join us.

Our January Pocket Pets workshop was on Monday, January 24th, 2022, in the 4-H BHB. We reviewed that Pocket Pets have specific nutritional needs. Pet owners need to know what their pets



can and cannot eat. Always check the ingredients of foods or snacks that are purchased for your Pocket Pets. We also reviewed that it can be useful to watch the pets and write down their activities - basically a Pocket Pets diary. Each project member reported something they had observed about their pets since our December workshop.

At the January workshop we learned about Skinny Pigs, Leopard geckos and pet mice. Project member Ayla showed her two "Skinny pigs" which is a common name for hairless guinea pigs. Her hairless guinea pigs do have some hair on their noses, and that is typical. There are also some skinny pigs with no hair at all. Ayla mentioned that if her pigs were outside, she would have to be careful about them getting sunburned. Like all other guinea pigs, they must be provided various things to chew on because their teeth keep growing. Ayla also showed us her leopard gecko. Geckos have about 100 small teeth that are replaced naturally every couple months.

Project member Jilly brought her two mice to show at our workshop. She's had the mice about a month and got them at a Helena pet store. She and her family have learned that the mice can run up people's arms very quickly.

Pocket Pets has monthly workshops. Check each month 4-H Newsletter and activity calendar for time and place. Every workshop this year we spend a few minutes on 4-H Record Book worksheets. All project members write down something they learn at each workshop and the THREE PROJECT GOALS that they have for this 4-H year 2021-2022 in Pocket Pets.

Sewing students - please come prepared: Prewash your fabrics before cutting out pattern If comfortable, cut the patterns prior to the workshop as there is limited space. Know your sewing machine - how to thread and rewind a bobbin, using the foot pedal. Minimum sewing supplies to have handy are: Scissors - preferably shears, Dressmaker pins, or quilting pins, Pin cushion, Seam ripper, 6" ruler, Seam gauge, Measuring tape, Marking pencil/pen, Sewing machine (if you don't have one, we have one or two machines to check out)

Knitting, crochet, embroidery and weaving this is also a time for these projects.

Knitting - bring your own needles and yarn; crochet - crochet hook and yarn; embroidery - embroidery thread, hoop and material; weaving - yarn or thread for your projects.

If you are interested in learning to weave there is a rigid heddle loom and some other hand looms available to use.

getting introduced to stream, river, pond and lake fishing at locations throughout the Helena area.

The Sport Fishing project of 4-H introduces beginning fishers to the sport while challenging the more advanced fishers. It is also about learning and enjoying the treasure we call the Montana outdoors. Notably, all project members, volunteers and family members are required to wear PFDs (personal flotation devices - also called life jackets) when in or near the water. There is an additional fee to participate in this project - the fee of \$15.00 per project member will be collected in person at the first meeting. Project books are not required.

FISHING TIP for February 2022:

Those of us that fish with live bait have only to look at your feet to find bait. Turn over stones in shallow water for crayfish, hellgrammites and nymphs. Try turning over dried leaves, grass, hay and straw to find crickets. Walk through the grass alongside roads and in the fields to locate grasshoppers. Breakup rotten logs and remove the bark from dead trees to find grubs. Turnover stones on land in damp spots to find worms. Another way to find worms is flip over cow pies as the worms will crawl into them for food.

Poultry Eggs and Poultry Breeding were the overall themes for our January workshop on Saturday, January 22nd 2022 in the BHB. Level one project members did pages 14 & 15 of Poultry Project



Poultry eggs vary in color, size and shape. All of them are edible.

Book level one ("Scratching the Surface") that had them working on a section called "This is No Yolk!" This section provides information about the parts of an egg. Activities were drawing and labeling the parts of eggs. Most project members brought some eggs to this meeting and so we discussed the eggs - parts, quality and grading. We noted eggs can be several colors, not just white; and that the size of a chicken egg can vary among birds of different ages and different breeds. Member Anyssa brought coturnix quail eggs. Apparently, the coturnix quail lays one egg every other day. The eggs are spotted and much smaller than typical chicken eggs. At the workshop we also discussed stages of embryo development during the time that fertilized eggs are incubating.

Level 2 project members learned about hens' reproductive tract and its parts by working through "Eggsactly Where Do Eggs Come From?" on pages 22 & 23 of the 4-H Poultry Project Book level two ("Testing Your Wings"). They each drew a hen's reproductive tract and reviewed the reproductive tract parts of a rooster.

Poultry project member Ashton gave a short presentation about eggs. AlizaJane, Ayla, Anyssa, and new member Luci brought birds for discussion. Then we had showmanship demonstrations. Project members worked on their Record Book pages, noting down something they learned about eggs or Poultry breeding at this workshop. Remember that to participate in the 4-H Fair this year, you will be required to provide your Record Book for a completeness review by project leaders – this applies to all 4-H projects.

Record book review dates will be announced both at project workshops and in the county newsletter. All livestock project members – including Poultry – must also be current in Quality Assurance in order to participate in the 4-H Fair. To be current, you must have completed a Quality Assurance course within 3 years of Fair time. Details about how to do Quality Assurance online can be found on the Lewis and Clark County 4-H website under the Projects tab. There is also a list in the same location on the website of everyone's training dates.
