At Pocket Pets workshops you will learn about - and experience - many different small animals. Our January workshop is currently scheduled for Monday, January 24th at 7:00 pm in the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building BHB at the Fairgrounds. If you are new to this project, please contact C.J. to confirm time and location for the January project meeting.

We had a Pocket Pets workshop on Monday, December 27th, 2021, in the 4-H Bill Hamilton Building.



We learned about Pocket Pet nutrition, with an emphasis on proper foods and snacks for Guinea Pigs. Nutrition is always important for Pocket Pets. Make sure you know what they need to eat for a healthy diet. Also, be especially sure to know what they <u>cannot</u> eat. Certain foods can be toxic to your little animal. So, do research and know what you can't feed them.

During our December meeting project members got the opportunity to make Christmas Crackers - which are basically snack presents for their pocket pets. We had available various appropriate snack choices for guinea pigs, fish and other small pets. To make a Christmas Cracker - start with an empty cardboard cylinder. You can use an empty toilet paper roll or a paper towel tube. You can put in some fluff, like you would use on a quilt or you can use some Timothy hay as "filling" if you want to. If you add some filling, push the it down; now add the snack goodies (if you don't use filling, just plan to use more food/snack pieces). You can top with more fluff to hold it in, or fill to the top with the food/snack pieces. Now you cover the tube - use cloth or even tissue paper. Red is a great color to use at Christmas time. Tie off both ends using string or yarn. Your pet now has both an activity and a snack. The activity will be when the pet is working its way into the tube to enjoy the snack. If making Fish snacks, you can put the fish food into small containers and even little clear globes.

Our goal is to have monthly workshops through June. Check each month 4-H Newsletter and activity calendar for time and place. During every workshop we'll spend a few minutes on 4-H Record Book worksheets. All project members will be asked to write down something they learn at each workshop and the THREE PROJECT GOALS that they have for this 4-H year 2021-2022 in Pocket Pets.

DON'T HAVE A POCKET PET? - OR TRYING TO DECIDE WHAT KIND TO GET? This project is for you because all you need is to be interested in learning about these small animals. We use the 4-H project book - and it is available for purchase at our workshops or can be ordered online.

Sewing, quilting, knitting, crochet, weaving, and embroidery are projects that take time to complete. We will be having workshops that start in October and go through April.

The workshops will be held at Capital Baptist Fellowship, 1727 Waukesha, at the corner of Laurel and Waukesha. The dates for the workshops are January 9, February 13, March 13, and April 3. We will have Sewing Revue on April 24.

The workshops will take place from 2:00-4:00 p.m.

Sewing students - please come prepared: Prewash your fabrics before cutting out pattern If comfortable, cut the patterns prior to the workshop as there is limited space. Know your sewing machine - how to thread and rewind a bobbin, using the foot pedal. Minimum sewing supplies to have handy are: Scissors - preferably shears, Dressmaker pins, or quilting pins, Pin cushion, Seam ripper, 6" ruler, Seam gauge, Measuring tape, Marking pencil/pen, Sewing machine (if you don't have one, we have one or two machines to check out)

Knitting, crochet, embroidery and weaving this is also a time for these projects.

Knitting - bring your own needles and yarn; crochet - crochet hook and yarn; embroidery - embroidery thread, hoop and material; weaving - yarn or thread for your projects.

Some material has been donated for projects.

Materials for an embroidery project have been donated.

If you are interested in learning to weave there is a rigid heddle loom and some other hand looms available to use.

SPORT FISHING will be starting up in April 2022 – only four months from now. There will be project meetings every Tuesday evening until mid-August. These weekly workshops typically include topics such as Montana fishing regulations, fishing knots, fish identification, rod & reel maintenance and casting practice. Project members will begin outdoor fishing in May, getting introduced to stream, river, pond and lake fishing at locations throughout the Helena area.

The Sport Fishing project of 4-H introduces beginning fishers to the sport while challenging the more advanced fishers. It is also about learning

and enjoying the treasure we call the Montana outdoors. Notably, all project members, volunteers and family members are required to wear PFDs (personal flotation devices - also called life jackets) when in or near the water. There is an additional fee to participate in this project; but project books are not required.

JANUARY FISHING TIP: If you are fishing with natural or live bait, make sure that it is fresh and clean. Clean also applies to lures and flies. By clean I don't mean a little dirt or sand on the bait, these will wash off quickly. But if you have handled gasoline, oil, insect repellent, sunscreen or any other chemicals, wash and rinse your hands thoroughly before you handle any bait, lure or fly. Fish have a keen sense of smell and even a trace of such foreign substances will repel them. Additionally, these foreign chemicals can weaken and/or ruin your fishing line whether it is monofilament, braided or fly line.
